  - Bike Ride Chairman, Outstanding Youth Chairman, and VIA Coordinator were officially added to Standing Committees.

- **Disaster Fund:** 88 Chapters, 2 Districts and 2 City Councils contributed \$2,598.27. 9 claims paid for \$5,500.00.
