Recipes:

TULSA JAIL HOUSE CHILI

1 ½ to 2 lbs. ground beef
1 medium onion, chopped
2 #3 cans kidney beans
2 (15 oz) cans tomato sauce
1 ½ qts. water
2 bay leaves
¼ cup chili powder
½ t. garlic salt
½ t. onion powder
½ t. oregano
½ t. crushed red pepper
3 t. salt
2 t. black pepper
½ t. onion salt

½ t. cayenne pepper

Brown ground beef; drain well on paper towels. Place in large pan; add remaining ingredients. Cook for 3 hours over medium to low heat. Makes a grease-free dish. May be frozen for future use. Yield: 16 servings.

KINGFISHER EGGPLANT-CLAM CASSEROLE

1 medium-sized eggplant
1 egg
Milk
1 ½ c. cracker crumbs
1 (7 ½ oz) can minced clams & juice
Salt and pepper to taste
Buttered bread crumbs

Peel and cube eggplant. Steam until tender; drain well. Beat egg in measuring cup; add milk to make 1 cup liquid. Mix all ingredients except bread crumbs together in large bowl. Place in buttered baking dish; top with bread crumbs. Bake for 30 minutes at 350 degrees. Yield: 6 servings.

OKEMAH PORK CHOP PIE

3 large onions 3 large apples 6 T. vegetable oil 6 pork chops

Peel and slice onions and apples; place 1 layer onions, 1 layer apples and 3 T. brown sugar in 8 x 8 inch or larger pan; arrange pork chops on top. Repeat layers with remaining onions, apples and brown sugar. Cover. Bake at 350 degrees for 2 hours. Yield: 4-6 servings.
