- B) A candidate for elected office must have held the office of Chapter or City Area Council President.
- C) Must be an active member of her chapter in good standing.
- D) Must have been an active ESA member a minimum of two years.
- E) Must have attended at least one previous State Conv.
- F) Give her consent in writing.
- G) Candidates for the office of 1st Vice Pres or 2nd Vice Pres shall have served at least three terms as an elected officer or two terms as an elected officer and two terms as an appointed chairperson prior to her nomination.
- H) Consent of the candidate and her qualifications shall be sent to the Nominating Committee by March 1.

Chapter Presidents, nominate one of your qualified chapter members to accept the challenge of a State office and mail it s-o-o-n!!! GRATEFUL GRANDPARENT

I am excited about the Letter Writing Campaign. Grateful Grandparent. that has already begun by several of our state chapters with more ready to get started to help the Kids of St. Jude. Having presented the Grateful Grandparent event at all four District Leadership Meetings proved to be a challenge due to the short amount of time allotted to explain the procedures. At this writing, I will condense the steps and hopefully do some clarifications. Chapter presidents, as early in your new year as you can, please hand out the sheets for your members to make their list of family, friends, neighbors, business acquaintances, etc. (Presidents, prior to this, please make copies of the names/addresses sheet for each of your members as St. Jude failed to send me copies, only an original.)

1st -- At the next chapter meeting each member is asked to bring back her list of names and addresses. You are now ready for the Letter Writing Party. Write on the printed letter provided, your salutations and sign your name at the closing of the brief letter. (Hopefully, you will write a short note why St. Jude means so much to you before signing your name.)

2nd -- At the bottom of that letter ... the part that the donor will clip off and mail back ... on the left side you are to fill out all the Member Information asked for so you and your chapter will get the proper credit for your efforts. (Be consistent in writing your name, e.g., use Jennifer each time, not Jen or Jenny at other times.)

3rd -- Having wirtten the name and address of your prospective donor on the face of the envelope with the *Epsilom Sigma Alpha* return address. Place the letter in the envelope. (To make it more personal write your name just above the ESA address.) Also, place the envelope with the window in the same letter. With your information and the donor's information completed at the bottom of your letter, he/she will clip that part off, turning it to the back side and place it in the envelope so the St. Jude address will show through the window.

4th -- The chapter president will then collect the completed letters, put all of them in a large

manila envelope or box and mail them to our regional ALSAC office attention to: Mandy Ward, 3700 W. Robinson, Norman, OK 73072. (Some are going to use the box provided by United States Postal Service.) She, in turn, will mail them to St. Jude along with the others.

5th -- Your credit will be taken from the CODE that is in the box just above *Member Information* that the donor will be returning with his/her donation to St. Jude.

** Sisters of ESA, I sincerely hope that each chapter will follow through on this project. As your Circle of Life Chairman, this is my goal. I realize that not every member will do this, but it is my great desire that ESA Oklahoma will have 100% chapter participation in this event, an event that takes such little time and effort, but state-wide it can have awesome results for the Kids of St. Jude.

Hello! While you are reading this I will be working hard to get the ESA Foundation Scholarship Applications out to all the high schools and colleges in the state. Wouldn't it be great if I could e-mail them the information....but my investigations in that matter have come up empty so far.

What's the most important thing you can do to help the Foundation? <u>BECOME A MEMBER</u>--\$25 TO JOIN. <u>STAY A MEMBER</u>--PAY YOUR \$15 DUES EACH YEAR.

Wouldn't you love to have a scholarship or endowment named for your chapter or council or someone you love? This can happen. It takes \$100 to establish a scholarship endowment. You then continue to contribute to it until there is \$5,000 in the fund. After that as the interest accrues over the \$5,000, scholarships can be paid out. Other ways you can contribute to the Foundation...for your friends or family members who have everything, make a contribution to the ESAF honoring them on their birthday. Of course, there is the FANTASY EVENT that you are invited to yearly that you can support with a contribution. (Oklahoma had the highest total contributions to the Fantasy Event this year.) Actually, you don't really need a reason to contribute....just do it!

Do you know that if you are a **Federal Employee** there is an annual event called the **Combined Federal Campaign** coming up in September, October and November? During this time federal employees may designate contributions for approved human health and welfare organizations by one time contributions or payroll deductions......The ESA Foundation has been <u>approved</u> and is on this list along with American Red Cross, Easter Seals, St. Jude, American Cancer Society.
