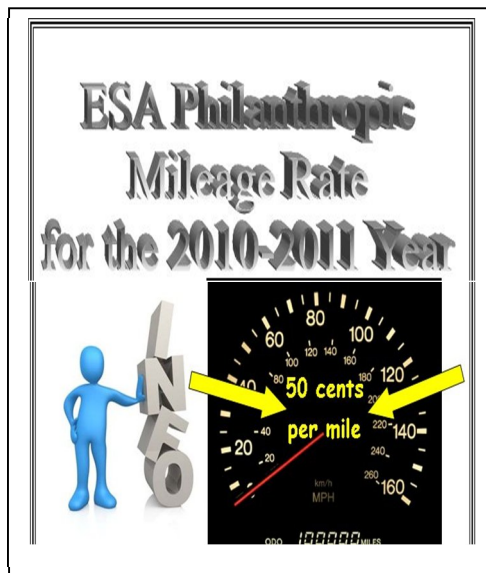

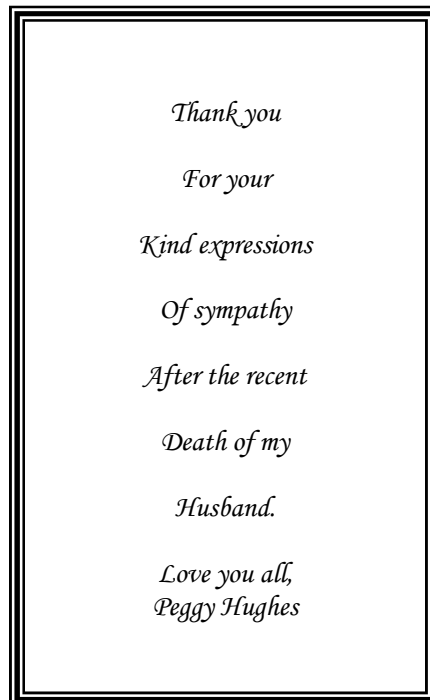

Enjoy all of the holidays. Delta Kappa wishes all of you the best. Until next time.

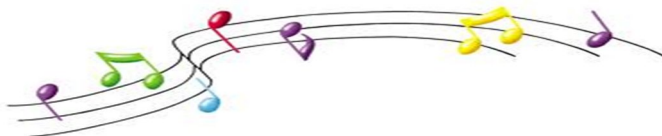

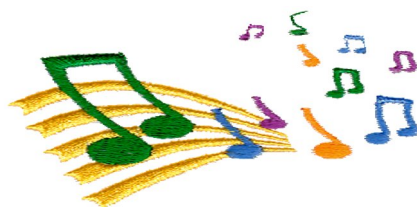
We made some tray favors for Life Senior Services during our October business meeting--put together some cute bags for Halloween.

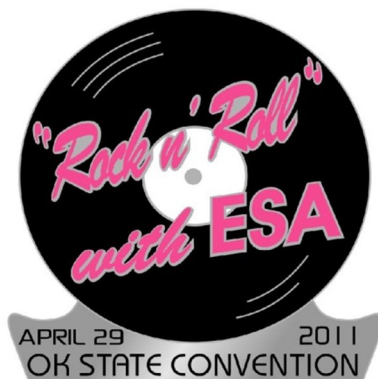
