I look forward to receiving lots more educational reports by April 1! I hope everyone has had fun this year with "Share the Gift of Music with ESA." I've had fun planning the educationals for you but I really enjoyed the times when we shared the gift of music together.

Here's a short educational that we did at the District IV meeting and Installation last Saturday, March 7, 2015.

Can you guess the musical instrument I'm about to describe?

- A tube-formed, American musical instrument with both ends of the tube uncovered.
- •One end of the tube is flattened, while the other end of the tube has a small circular opening.
- •Around two-thirds down the instrument there is another circular hole. This hole leads to a small chamber, where a wax-membrane is situated. The membrane, which is fixed around the edges by a circular cylinder-ring, is free to oscillate.
- •It may be made out of plastic or metal and can have all sorts of different shapes.

Have you guessed it yet? If not, then here's one more hint: You hum rather than blow into the instrument. – Yes, it is a Kazoo!

Did you know the kazoo was invented in the 1840's and first presented to the world at the Georgia State Fair in 1852 as the "Down South Submarine." Legends tells us that the kazoo was invented by collaboration of an African American by the name of Alabama Vest and a German American clockmaker, Thaddeus Von Clegg but commercial production of the kazoo began many years later in 1912. Emil Sorg started the manufacturing of the kazoo in Western New York. Sorg joined up with Michael McIntyre, a Buffalo tool and die maker and production moved to Eden, NY, where the factory museum remains today as a working museum.

The kazoo is a type of mirliton, which is a membranophone, one of a class of instruments which modifies its player's voice by way of a vibrating membrane. It adds a "buzzing" timbral quality to a player's voice. When the player hums rather than blows into the instrument, the oscillating air pressure of the hum makes the kazoo's membrane vibrate – resulting in a sound that varies in pitch and loudness. Players can produce different sounds by singing specific syllables such as doo, who, rrrr or brrr into the kazoo.



Now reads

ARTICLE IX - GENERAL BOARD

Section 1. COMPOSITON - The standing committees of this Council shall be: Association of the Arts, Auditor, Awards, Chaplain, Circle of Life, Contest, Convention, Credentials, DIANA, Directory, Easter Seals, ESA Foundation Counselor (2 yr.), Membership, Outstanding Chapter, Outstanding Youth, Philanthropic, Publicity, Scrapbook, and Sooner Seniorette President, International Officer(s), Past International Council President(s), and past and current E.S.A. Foundation Board Members.

Proposed to read

Section 1. COMPOSITION - The standing committees of this Council shall be: Association of the Arts, Auditor, Awards, Chaplain, Circle of Life, Contest, Convention, Credentials, DIANA, Directory, Easter Seals, ESA Foundation Counselor (2 yr.), Membership, Outstanding Chapter, Outstanding Youth, Philanthropic, Publicity, Scrapbook, and Sooner Seniorette President, International Officer(s), Past International Council President(s), and past and current E.S.A. Foundation Board Members. The President shall appoint two (2) MARC Representatives to the MARC general board as voting delegates at the MARC meetings. They will serve as liaison between the Oklahoma State Council and MARC keeping the membership informed of activities.

Reason

The Oklahoma State Council accepted an invitation to join the Midwest Area Regional Council (MARC). To meet the requirements of MARC two (2) representatives are required for the MARC general board.

MARC Bylaws

Article IX. Section 1. The general board shall consist of two (2) representatives and the state president or their alternate of each member state council. No state may have more than three (3) official members on the general board.

Section 2. Meetings of the general board shall be held during the International Convention and the annual leadership conference; also, immediately following the annual leadership conference if deemed necessary by the newly elected president.

Now reads

ARTICLE VIII. Section 1. The President shall preside at all state meetings, the annual convention and conduct an annual Leadership Seminar. The President shall appoint tellers, chairpersons of standing committees, except Budget, Convention, Nominating and Sooner Seniorette President. The President shall be ex-officio member of all committees, except Nominating. The President shall be an authorized signer on all Oklahoma State Council accounts. The President shall be bonded. She shall serve one (1) term as Jr. Past President and one (1) term as Sr. Past President.

Change to read

ARTICLE VIII. Section 1. The President shall preside at all state meetings, the annual convention and conduct an annual Leadership Seminar. The President shall appoint tellers, chairpersons of standing committees, except Budget, Convention, Nominating and Sooner Seniorette President. The President shall be ex-officio member of all committees, except Nominating. The President shall be an authorized signer on all Oklahoma State Council accounts. The President shall be bonded. She shall serve one (1) term as Jr. Past President and one (1) term as Sr. Past President. *The President, or designated alternate, will represent the Oklahoma State Council at the Midwest Area Regional Council (MARC) meetings.*

Reason

The State Council President is also representative, or designated alternate, to the MARC general board as required by the MARC bylaws.

ARTICLE VIII – DUTIES OF ELECTED OFFICERS

(As it reads now)

Section 2. The First Vice President by virtue of her office shall be known as President Elect. The First Vice President shall assume the duties of the President in the event the President is unable to do so. She shall serve as Chairperson of the Nominating Committee, prepare copies of the ballot and deliver to the Credentials Chairperson prior to convention. She shall be advisor to the District Coordinators and Vice Coordinators. The first Vice President shall be an authorized Signer of all Oklahoma State Council bank accounts and shall be bonded. She shall be installed President at the convention following her term as First Vice President.

(Change to read)

Section 2. The First Vice President by virtue of her office shall be known as President Elect. The First Vice President shall assume the duties of the President in the event the President is unable to do so. **She shall be the Membership Chairman.** She shall serve as Chairperson of the Nominating Committee, prepare copies of the ballot and deliver to the Credentials Chairperson prior to convention. The first Vice President shall be an authorized Signer of all Oklahoma State Council bank accounts and shall be bonded. She shall be installed President at the convention following her term as First Vice President.

(As it now reads)

Section 9. The Junior Past President shall be a member of the Budget Committee. The Junior Past President shall be the Disaster Fund Chairman. She shall receive and record Disaster Funds donated by chapter and/or members and forward to the International Council Disaster Fund Chairman, with a copy to the State President. The Disaster Fund Chairman shall file claims as requested. She shall publish names and amounts of contributions in the August/September and February/March issues of the Petticoat Journal.

(Change to read)

Section 9. The Junior Past President shall be a member of the Budget Committee. The Junior Past President shall be the Disaster Fund Chairman. She shall receive and record Disaster Funds donated by chapter and/or members and forward to the International Council Disaster Fund Chairman, with a copy to the State President. The Disaster Fund Chairman shall file claims as requested. She shall publish names and amounts of contributions in the August/September and February/March issues of the Petticoat Journal. **She shall be advisor to the District Coordinators and Vice Coordinators.**

<u>ARTICLE IX – GENERAL BOARD</u>

Section 1. COMPOSITION

(Remove Membership)

Reason for the Change. Section 2. The First Vice President's expenses for IC/Headquarters Leadership are paid by the Oklahoma State Council, as well as part of the expenses for the 2nd Vice President. 
