

# American Indian Artist Dana Tiger

**Dana Irene Tiger** is an award winning, internationally acclaimed artist. She is a member of the Muscogee (Creek) Nation and is of Seminole and Cherokee descent. She was born in 1961 in Muskogee to legendary artist Jerome Tiger and Peggy Richmond. Her father was a full blood Indian of Muskogee-Seminole heritage and her mother is a member of the Cherokee Tribe. Tiger's father died of an accidental gunshot wound when she was 5 years old. She turned to his art as a way to know him and that engagement, coupled with the tutelage of her uncle, renowned painter Johnny Tiger Jr., exposed Dana both to the richness of her culture and to the bounty of her family's artistic tradition. Tiger attended Oklahoma State University from 1981-1984 as a student in the College of Arts and Sciences. She later attended Bacone College. Tiger first began painting at age 24, after she left Oklahoma State University. Her themes of strong women grew out of personal experiences of discrimination and tragedy. She uses art as a medium to empower women. Characteristics of her paintings are resilient women depicted in both historical and contemporary leadership positions, usually in watercolor or acrylic.

"By realizing the natural strength and courage of women in my ancestry, I hope to portray the historical dignity and contemporary determination of Native American women" Dana's work portrays Native American women as historical and contemporary leaders. Her art provides us with a glimpse of wisdom and spirit, embodied in the subjects' determination to resolve and persevere. This ability is drawn from her experiences as a young Creek, Seminole, and Cherokee woman, surrounded by the art of her father, Jerome Tiger, whose influence is felt wherever there is Native American all, and the guidance of her mother, Peggy Tiger. Tiger often combines art work and advocacy, promoting benefits for the AIDS Coalition for Indian Outreach, the American Cancer Society, the National Organization for Women, and the Ozark Literacy Council. Native American health is a particular focus.

In recognition of her accomplishments Dana was inducted into the Oklahoma Women's Hall of Fame in 2001.

#### ARTICLE XVII – PARLIAMENTARY AUTHORITY

Robert's Rules of Order shall govern the Oklahoma State Council in all cases not provided for in these bylaws or International Council Bylaws.

#### **ARTICLE XVIII – AMENDMENTS**

These bylaws may be amended every odd year at the annual convention of the Oklahoma State Council by a two-thirds vote of voting delegates present and voting, provided amendments have been approved by the Executive and General Board, and published in the April/May issue of the Petticoat Journal. Proposed amendments must be submitted to the State Parliamentarian by March 1.

These bylaws may be amended in even numbered years when deemed necessary by the Executive Board, with all the same rules and voting requirements as above.

# *I liked the following story and thought you might like it too:* Red Marbles!...

I was at the corner grocery store buying some early potatoes. I noticed a small boy, delicate of bone and feature, ragged but clean, hungrily appraising a basket of freshly picked green peas. I paid for my potatoes but was also drawn to the display of fresh green peas. I am a pushover for creamed peas and new potatoes. Pondering the peas, I couldn't help overhearing the conversation between Mr. Miller (the store owner) and the ragged boy next to me.

'Hello Barry, how are you today?' 'H'lo, Mr. Miller. Fine, thank ya. Jus' admirin' them peas. They sure look good..' 'They are good, Barry.. How's your Ma?' 'Fine. Gittin' stronger alla' time.'

'Would you like to take some home?' asked Mr. Miller.
'No, Sir. Got nuthin' to pay for 'em with.'
'Well, what have you to trade me for some of those peas?'
'All I got's my prize marble here.'
'Is that right? Let me see it' said Miller
'Here 'tis. She's a dandy.'
'I can see that. Hmm mmm, only thing is this one is blue and I sort of go for red. Do you have a red one like this at home?' the store owner asked..
'Not zackley but almost.'
'Tell you what. Take this sack of peas home with you and next trip this way let me look at that red marble'. Mr. Miller told the boy.

'Sure will. Thanks Mr. Miller.'

Mrs... Miller, who had been standing nearby, came over to help me. With a smile she said, 'There are two other boys like him in our community, all three are in very poor circumstances.. Jim just loves to bargain with them for peas, apples, tomatoes, or whatever.. When they come back with their red marbles, and they always do, he decides he doesn't like red after all and he sends them home with a bag of produce for a green marble or an orange one, when they come on their next trip to the store.'

I left the store smiling to myself, impressed with this man. A short time later I moved to Colorado, but I never forgot the story of this man, the boys, and their bartering for marbles.

Several years went by, each more rapid than the previous one. Just recently I had occasion to visit some old friends in that Idaho community and while I was there learned that Mr. Miller had died. They were having his visitation that evening and knowing my friends wanted to go, I agreed to accompany them. Upon arrival at the mortuary we fell into line to meet the relatives of the deceased and to offer whatever words of comfort we could

Ahead of us in line were three young men. One was in an army uniform and the other two wore nice haircuts, dark suits and white shirts...all very professional looking. They approached Mrs. Miller, standing composed and smiling by her husband's casket.

Each of the young men hugged her, kissed her on the cheek, spoke briefly with her and moved on to the casket. Her misty light blue eyes followed them as, one by one, each young man stopped briefly and placed his own warm hand over the cold pale hand in the casket. Each left the mortuary awkwardly, wiping his eyes.

Our turn came to meet Mrs. Miller. I told her who I was and reminded her of the story from those many years ago and what she had told me about her husband's bartering for marbles. With her eyes glistening, she took my hand and led me to the casket.

'Those three young men who just left were the boys I told you about. They just told me how they appreciated the things Jim 'traded' them. Now, at last, when Jim could not change his mind about color or size....they came to pay their debt.'

'We've never had a great deal of the wealth of this world,' she confided, 'but right now, Jim would consider himself the richest man in Idaho ..' With loving gentleness she lifted the lifeless fingers of her deceased husband. Resting underneath were three exquisitely shined red marbles.

"The Hope for Heroes Workshop; this idea was inspired by an article that Deborah Willoughby, SERCH Editor from North Carolina had in a recent SERCH. She explained how she had engaged her company to collect coupons (easy and no money involved). The only effort was to sort through the coupons, clip them and categorize them (food/non-food). She mailed her coupons to <u>http://</u> <u>thekrazycouponlady.com/coupons-for-military</u>. She estimated they raised \$3,700.00 in savings from the coupons.

All she did was put a news bulletin up at work detailing coupons needed, why and who would benefit. She also had collection boxes and directions on where they would be located so they could drop off their coupons. How easy is that?




