EPSILON SIGMA ALPHA INTERNATIONAL OKLAHOMA STATE COUNCIL MEETING March 11, 2017 Goodrich United Methodist Church Norman, OK

The Oklahoma State Council Meeting was called to order at 10:40 a.m. by President Nancy Baucom. She thanked everyone for coming to her last state council meeting for her year.

Members repeated the opening ritual followed by Chaplain Peggy Hughes giving the prayer and leading the Pledge of Allegiance.

Roll call was taken from registration. Lunch hostesses were Delta Kappa.

There were no guests, pledges, Elans, Desas, or Mesas. First-time attendee and pledge, Doylene Heaton, Delta Kappa, was introduced.

Senior Seniorettes were asked to stand and each was presented a small gift from President Nancy and thanked for their guidance and dedication to ESA.

The committee to read the September Leadership minutes was Ramona Paine, chair, Lora Thompson, and Libby Zaage. In Ramona's absence, Lora reported the minutes were correct as printed. They will be placed on file.

The committee to read today's minutes is Billye Peterson, chair, Sandy Lackey, and Kay Brader.

1st Vice President/Nominating Chair Peggie Sprinkle thanked her nominating committee. She introduced the following 2017-18 slate of officers and each was given a big silver star: Petticoat Journal Editor, Linda Jones; State Project Director, Peggy Hughes; Parliamentarian, Sylvia Ochs; Treasurer, Mona Quaid; Recording Secretary, Elise Jimison; Corresponding Secretary, Leslie Farabee; 2nd Vice President, Linda Leveridge; 1st Vice President, Margaret Kramer; President, Peggie Sprinkle.

2nd Vice President/Educational Director Margaret Kramer asked each table to discuss what we have done to indulge in happiness during the year. A slide show was presented on "What is Happiness, Learn to be Happy." A discussion followed on the connection between music, health, happiness, and efficiency. We sang happy birthday to Gwynn Nell Swanson.

Treasurer Jenny Lizama was absent. President Nancy stated the report will be emailed and printed in the next Petticoat Journal.

1st Vice President/Nominating Chairman Peggie Sprinkle read Article VII-Section 1 from Oklahoma State Council bylaws which states that active members may submit nominations from the floor at First General Assembly at the convention.

State Project Director Linda Leveridge reported a beginning balance of \$5,325.01 with \$2,360.84 being distributed to OSB, and \$2,964.16 being given to OSD. Donations received to date are \$1,172.01. Linda mentioned the need for additional sponsors for students at OSB. She also told of students at OSD going to Washington, DC. OSD will be having an open house Wednesday, March 30, 2017, called "The Puzzle." All chapters are invited and encouraged to RSVP Marsha Cole at 580-622-4909.

Petticoat Journal Editor Lori Few moved upon recommendation of the Executive/General Board that the price of the PJ for first class mail remain at \$20 per subscription. Coming from a committee no second was required; motion carried.

Jr. Past President/Disaster Fund Chairman Billye Peterson said she has received \$2,050.87 so far. There have been 21 chapters submitting donations and one claim received today.

Peggie Sprinkle thanked everyone for allowing her to attend Leadership at Denver. She said she learned about new programs for ESA for St. Jude, the ESA Foundation, and membership. Handouts were given out challenging chapters to have community outreach projects. She also presented a new St. Jude program called "Kids Helping Kids." Vivian Gibson received an appreciation award as ESA Foundation State Counselor. Margaret Kramer who also attended Leadership encouraged everyone to add to the new ESA Inspiration Library by sharing their projects on the ESA website.

Sandy Lackey, District 5 Coordinator, mentioned bylaw changes they recently made and suggested that perhaps district meetings could be held during state meetings in breakout sessions, on a rotation with other cities in the district, rotating the district project to include each city, or having meetings following OSD and OSB meetings. The idea to combine District 3 and District 5 was tabled so that these new ideas could be tried.

A convention skit enticing everyone to attend was presented by Linda Leveridge, Robbin Brown, Vivian Gibson, Lola Jaegers, Gwynn Nell Swanson, Lora Thompson, and Janice Shockley.

Meeting adjourned for lunch at 12 p.m. with Chaplain Peggy Hughes saying grace.

Meeting reconvened by President Nancy after lunch.

A "Random Act of Kindness Activity" was presented by Kayla Powell, Beta Mu member. Attendees were given supplies to assemble one of three choices of cards and were to write someone a random act of kindness.

Auditor Lola Jaegers reported preliminary audits were completed on books for State Project, Petticoat Journal, and the Directory.

Awards Chair Robyn Ryan requested years of services and Pallas Athene degrees need to be turned in by April 1. She encouraged everyone to write an essay on "What ESA Means to Me" for either 1 year or less or more than 1 year, also due April 1.

2017 Convention Co-Chair Cathy Holsted reported cinnamon rolls will be sold to raise money for the convention, hotel reservations need to be in by March 28, and program ads need to be turned in.

Directory Chair Gwynn Nell Swanson reported 90 directories were printed, 83 directories were sold at \$8 each, and 8 directories are available at half price. Gwynn Nell stated that upon recommendation from the Executive Board, the price for directories will remain at \$8 each. Coming from a committee no second was required; motion carried.

ESA Foundation Counselor Vivian Gibson reported scholarship winners will be notified in late May or early June. A new state contest will be implemented this year for donations to the Foundation; for example dollar amount of donated items for auction, or money bid on auction items can count as monetary value donation. It must be reported on the Service report and sent to Vivian. Hours and travel are not counted for this contest. She also requested assistance with the auction at convention. Auction items can be checked in at 1 p.m.

OK MARC Rep Deb Hughes reminded us of MARC convention October 13-15, 2017 in Detroit, Michigan.

Membership Chair Mona Quaid stated that letters were sent out to all chapters asking for names of new members so they can be recognized at State Convention.

Outstanding Chapter Chairman June Miller had no report.

Publicity Chairman Sylvia Ochs urged chapters to send her articles as only two had done so already.

President Nancy requested material for her scrapbook be sent to Peggy Campbell or Patty Heer by April 15th.

Web Master Aletha Bolt asked those members who it affected to please make a decision by State Convention whether to continue web email accounts.

Door prizes were given out.

Margaret Kramer reminded everyone deadline for educationals is April 1st.

Don't forget the State Council Fundraiser, raffle tickets for one week in Branson and a \$500 gift card.

Remaining directories are half price – see Gwynn Nell Swanson.

President/Convention charms are on sale for \$5 each.

Don't forget the convention fundraiser, the 50/50 jar.

Peggie Sprinkle stated the remaining position on her board is membership.

Liz King donated \$50 from the Pampered Chef fundraiser to the State Council.

Libby Zaage announced the District II meeting will be Saturday, March 18, 2017, in Guthrie at the Noble Avenue Baptist Church

The hotel registration deadline is March 28 and convention application deadline is April 14th.

Chapters are asked to donate baskets or gift cards for the auction at Convention.

President Nancy thanked everyone for coming and adjourned the meeting at 2 p.m. Members repeated the closing ritual.



From the desk of Margaret Kramer, Second VP, Educational Director

I have been talking about happiness for almost a year now, and I have found that everyone has their own ideas about what will bring us more of it. Have you thought about what brings you happiness? Marcia Sirota, Author, speaker, coach and MD states: there are four key principles that together, can create significantly more happiness for ourselves, as well as for those around us.

Marcia calls these principles the "four pillars of happiness," and they're really quite simple. They all involve being open in some way; open to the truth, to love, to ourselves and to others.



Pillar #1: Open heart

In order to be happy, we must have an open heart. We need to love and accept ourselves, just as we are, and we need to give love to those around us, and let in love from others as well.

Self-love and self-compassion create inner peace, which directly leads to happiness. Having an open heart makes us feel the attachments that exist between all living beings; it give us a deep sense of belonging. Instead of the pain of alienation, we feel the comfort and reassurance of connection.

Pillar #2: Open Mind

For true happiness, we need to let go of our unnecessary mental baggage, including hurtful prejudices, false beliefs, incorrect attitudes, inappropriate expectations and unrealistic fears.

If we want to be happy, we need mental flexibility; the capacity to learn, change our minds and to see things from a different perspective. Mental rigidity creates suffering, but an open mind allows us to truly be in the flow.

Pillar #3: Open Eyes

We need to face the truth about our past and also see what's in front of us, right now. We must let go of our counterproductive habits of denial, rewriting history and wishful thinking and instead, be fully present and engaged in our lives.

Being able to face the truth of our past and present enables us to live our lives to the fullest. Instead of creating an unhappy future based on hopeful fantasy, habitual thinking patterns or avoidance, we can create a happier life based on realistic, meaningful choices.

Pillar #4: Open Arms

Selfishness has become far too popular these days, and it's a big reason why we're unhappy and feel so empty and frustrated. The answer to happiness isn't in accumulating more money or stuff, nor in becoming more famous or exerting more influence.

The answer to happiness is in sharing what we have with others; recognizing the truth of our interdependence and being generous and altruistic with our fellow human beings.

Studies have shown that we experience much more happiness from giving to others than from taking. When we open our arms, it satisfies one of our deepest needs: the need to give of ourselves.

Aside from being good for others, being generous feeds our soul and inspires those around us to be more altruistic. In that way, it creates happiness for everyone.

Try practicing these four pillars of happiness. Dr. Sirota guarantees that your life will dramatically change for the better, and at the same time, you'll be making others happy too.

However, I personally believe that we must take time to be good to ourselves in order to recharge and retain the health and energy necessary to continue to give of ourselves to others and maintain the high standards that we set for doing the good works we as ESA Sisters do. So my farewell advise to you as your Second Vice President, Educational Director is to "Indulge in Happiness" as often as you can.

ESA members across the country participated at their local walks and fundraised in areas without live walks. In 2016, ESA was a Silver Level National Team Partner with a fundraising goal of \$75,000. ESA not only met the goal, but far exceeded it. ESA's proudly committed to raising \$85,000 during the 2017 Walk which will take place September 23, 2017. Mark your calendars!

2017 is off to a great start with ESA fundraising events. Several fundraisers took place in February. Delta Kappa hosted a "St. Jude Closet Sale" and both Oklahoma City and Tulsa participated in St. Jude Radio-thons. On February 2nd and 3rd, Twister 101.9 sponsored their event raising over \$106,000 and Tulsa's K95.5 hosted their event February 9th and 10th, raising over \$146,000.

The St. Jude Affiliate Clinic at St. Francis is one of only eight affiliates nationwide.


