MINUTES

President Nancy welcomed everyone. Members stood for the opening ritual. Aletha Bolt led the Pledge of Allegiance, and Peggie Sprinkle gave the thought for the day.

Attendance was taken from registration.

Nancy announced state officers would have a name card in front of them so members could know their leaders, and she would introduce them as they gave their reports. She had the 2016-17 board members stand. The Sooner Seniorettes were thanked for their guidance and dedication to ESA and given a small gift.

President Nancy reported a motion via a phone/e-mail poll from the executive board to remove Synovia Lemmings as recording secretary for nonperformance of duties as supported by Standing Rule 1C. Coming from a committee no second was required. Motion carried. Liz King was appointed State Recording Secretary.

There was 1 guest (speaker), 1 first-time attendee, 1 new pledge, no Elans, Desas, or Mesas. Each was given a little sweet gift from the President.

The committee to read the minutes of the June State Council Meeting was Aletha Bolt, Chair, Vivian Gibson, and Linda Jones. Aletha reported the minutes were constructed by the committee and will be uploaded to the website.

The report was filed for audit.

ESA Foundation Counselor Vivian Gibson & ESA Foundation Director & Newsletter Editor Judi York presented a workshop on the ESA Foundation. Vivian reported on grants and applications were distributed. She also mentioned the turn around fund and how to begin an irrevocable endowment. Judi explained the purpose of the foundation and reported on becoming a life active member and being a Planned Giver. She also

talked about the Humanitarian and Stewardship awards. Judi was nominated as beauty contestant fundraiser for MARC scholarships and asked for donations for the October MARC meeting.

State Project Director Linda Leveridge stated she had not received any names from Sulfur but she did have adoption forms for anyone interested in adopting a child at School for the Deaf or School for the Blind. She announced the OSD tour would be December 10, 2016, and Christmas gifts could be taken at this time. The District III and IV meetings would be held in conjunction with the OSB tour on Feb. 18, 2017.

1st Vice President/Nominating Chairman Peggie Sprinkle requested members go back to chapters and encourage volunteers for elective and council board chairs and for current board members to let her know if they want to continue as chairs. Notify nominating committee members Sylvia Ochs, Deb Hughes, Tina Davenport-McKamie, or Gwynn Nell Swanson if interested in an elected position. She discussed "Am I Really Needed" and asked all to take back to chapters.

Nancy announced a 15-minute break for Shopping on the Mall.

The president introduced the guest speaker, radio host and author Cheryl Ginnings, who showed a slide presentation, "Courage to Overcome," speaking on suicide prevention. Mrs. Ginning's website is www.courage2overcome.com.

A skit was presented encouraging attendance to the 2017 Oklahoma State Convention.

Meeting was adjourned for lunch.

President Nancy reconvened the meeting. Regrets were read by Corresponding Secretary Joyce Gibson.

President Nancy presented highlights from the IC convention in Loveland, CO, she attended with 19 Oklahoma members and announced awards received. Practice Gratitude


What are you most grateful for this holiday season and how can you express this gratitude in your daily life?






