



First and foremost I want to increase the number of active Foundation members in our state. While we have chapters participating, our individual Foundation members could use a boost. I understand that this is not something I can do alone and so that is why I am asking others to get involved. I would like to challenge the District Coordinators to see who can get the most new members in their respective districts. I would also like to ask for help in promoting the scholarships available by asking members for their assistance in getting the word out to schools in their areas. We have over 500 school districts in the state of Oklahoma and every high school counselor needs to be aware of the scholarship opportunities available for graduating students. The same goes for our colleges and universities. This sounds like a diaurting task but one that can be accomplished with everyone's help. We had 347 students apply for scholarships last year. Finding the right parties to sign off on those may be the challenge, but hopefully we can get that accomplished. Hopefully, my articles in the state newsletter will help. My predecessor tells me she loved representing the state as the Foundation Counselor so that motivates me to want to do well. That is why I need your help. Dear Oklahoma sisters,

It is with a heavy heart I regret to inform you that as of August 31, 2017, Easter Seals of Oklahoma has disaffiliated with Easter Seals and is now Woven life.

They are still the same non-profit, in the same location with all the same programs. Due to the money they were required to pay Easter Seals each month, and through their research, they found there was a lack of brand recognition and the benefit of the brands association had depleted over time. They said this change will allow them to focus solely on the needs of their community while ensuring all the money raised stays locally.

I called ESA headquarters and they referred me to Theda Hall who is our IC Easter Seals Chairman. I explained the problem to her and the fact that the money we will provide Easter Seals will not stay in Oklahoma now and was curious how other states that don't have facilities in their state handle their donations. Of course she wants us to continue to support Easter Seals but it is up to each state and chapter to determine where they want their donations to go.

Deb Hughes, past IC Easter seals chairman helped me and called Easter seals headquarters in Chicago. They are working on seeking another affiliate to serve our state but in the meantime, they sent us several websites to check out. They will try to get us that information just as soon as possible. I will give the websites to Aletha Bolt to put on our website.

This is a matter that is pressing and needs to be addressed so that all the chapters in Oklahoma are informed of this change.

So far we have donated \$1063.00 to Easter Seals: \$963.00 from the convention silent auction and \$100.00 from Zeta Gamma #4253.

HOPE FOR HEROES, by Marla Tyndall

This year we would like for everyone to make pillow cases from colorful (washable) fabric for each soldier to have for his own. It would be nice if you could include a note as to who made it for them and encouragement.

You can do this as a chapter social, with some cutting, some sewing, and some writing notes.

A standard pillow is 26" long by 21" wide --- so you could make the pillow case 30" x 24". -1-3/4 yard of 45" wide fabric will make 2 cases. 1-1/3 yard of 60" wide fabric will make 2 cases. If you have remnants you can always piece colors for contrasting trim to make them.

Sewing the seam can be a normal seam, which might ravel out or if someone knows how to do a French seam that would be great. Also if someone has a multi lock machine (to serge) this will work great too.
