MONA QUAID JOHNSTON EDUCATIONAL DIRECTOR 2018-19

Research has shown that laughter can have health benefits from reducing food cravings, increasing our threshold for pain, strengthening the immune system, healing and reducing stress. Why does laughter reduce stress?

- **Physical release** Laughter can lead to an emotional and physical release, as does crying. Sometimes we can cry and laugh at the same time "cry with laughter". This helps release emotions
- Hormones laughter can help reduce stress hormones like epinephrine/adrenaline and
 cortisol, dopamine and growth hormones. It can increase levels of positive hormones like
 endorphins. Laughter can increase antibody producing cells that can increase the effectiveness
 of T-cells, which improve our immune system.
- **Distraction** laughter us to focus away from our stress, anger and negative emotions.
- **Internal workou**t Laughter makes use of our diaphragm, abdominal muscles, shoulders and leads to relaxed muscles after.
- **Social benefits** laughter can help us to interact with others, reduce our stress, reduce their stress, improve our interactions with others.
- **Perspective** people can sometimes see things as a threat or challenge. Humor can make us see things in a different way in a humorous way, so making it more positive and less threatening.

Using laughter to reduce stress -

We can reduce our stress through laughter in a range of ways. These may include

- Watching funny films and TV programs.
- Laughing with friends and family.
- Fake it! Studies have shown that even a fake smile or laugh can have positive effects, so the more we smile the more we feel positive.
- Try to have more fun in your life.
- Try to see more humor in your life.om

"BEE THE CHANGE IN ESA"


The new Eastern District of Oklahoma ESA met on February 23rd for our annual meeting at the Oklahoma School for the Blind in Muskogee, Oklahoma.

OKLAHOMA STATE COUNCIL PROPOSED BYLAW CHANGES

With the merging of District's II and IV and District's III and V it is necessary to update the OK State Council By-Law's

Article XIV – District Councils

Section 1. There shall be four (4) districts known as District II, District IV and District V. Districts shall be divided by counties or cities.

Delete the above statement and all four paragraphs of current Division of Districts by cities and counties listed in bylaw.

Change to read:

There shall be two (2) districts known as Western District and Eastern District.

Western District shall now consist of the Counties of

Alfalfa; Beaver; Blaine; Canadian; Cimarron; Custer; Dewey; Ellis; Garfield; Grant; Harper; Kingfisher; Lincoln; Logan; Major; Noble; Oklahoma; Payne; Roger Mills; Texas; Woods; Woodward; Beckham; Caddo; Canadian; Carter; Cleveland; Comanche; Cotton; Garvin; Greer; Grady; Harmon; Jackson; Jefferson; Johnston; Kiowa; Love; Marshall; McClain; Murray; Pontotoc; Pottawatomie; Seminole; Stephens; Tillman; Washita.

Eastern District shall now consist of the Counties of


Cherokee; Craig; Creek; Delaware; Kay; Mayes; Nowata; Osage; Ottawa; Pawnee; Rogers; Tulsa; Washington; Adair; Atoka; Bryan; Choctaw; Coal; Haskell; Hughes; Latimer; Leflore; McCurtain; McIntosh; Muskogee; Okfuskee; Okmulgee; Pittsburg; Pushmataha; Sequoyah; Wagoner.

- Each District shall have bylaws provided they do not conflict with the Oklahoma State Council bylaws and shall provide a current copy of those bylaws to the State President and Parliamentarian.
- Each District shall have one (1) voting member on the State Executive Board, which shall be the District Coordinator.
 - 1. Coordinator shall attend all State Council meetings.
 - 2. The number of District meetings shall be the discretion of the District.
 - 3. One (1) meeting shall be a Leadership Seminar.
 - 4. The district Secretary shall provide minutes to State Recording Secretary within thirty days after the meeting.
 - 5. District Awards will be given in the District.

The Proposed Changes were approved during an Executive Board Teleconference meeting on Saturday March 2, 2019 and will go to a vote at 2019 OK State Convention.

Please read and review the proposed Bylaw Changes and be prepared to vote.




