

ESA MUSIC FOR THE SOUL

Music **unquestionably** affects our emotions. We tend to listen to music that **reflects our mood**. When we're happy we may listen to upbeat music; when we're sad we may listen to slower, moving songs; when we're angry we may listen to darker music with heavy guitar, drums, and vocals that reflect our level of anger.



Because the brain is so completely engaged in listening to music, it's one of the parts of a situation that is remembered most clearly later on. Songs and pieces of music can serve as powerful triggers for memories - hence the cliché about couples and "their song.". And let's not forget the language aspect of music.

Music makes you teel better. Music can make us feel uplifted, contented and can improve our health, too. Whether you're performing it or listening to it, music can increase your happiness (as well as the happiness of those around you.) Music can lift the spirits. But science has now shown it has a physical effect on our bodies, too.



Music is known to tap into various parts of the brain, that is why it is utilized by many experts in treating depressed or anxious patients. The meter, timber, rhythm and pitch of music are managed in areas of the brain that deal with emotions and mood. These key areas are the hippocampus, prefrontal cortex and the parietal lobe. The hippocampus, a structure of the limbic system, is responsible for spatial orientation, navigation and the consolidation of new memories. It also brings about emotional responses. The prefrontal cortex, on the other hand, manages

extreme impulses and emotions. Known as the "seat of good judgment," it enables one to make good and acceptable calls so that inappropriate behaviors are prevented. As for the parietal lobe, it is in charge of spatial orientation, information processing and cognition, affects many others.



Sponsoring a student at the Oklahoma School for the Deaf is an opportunity to support the growth of a student academically, socially, and emotionally. It is an opportunity to give in the truest and lost gracious sense of the word—anonymously. Students receiving sponsorship are not told who their sponsors are, but learn the life lesson of being appreciative and saying "thank you" through cards, pictures, and notes which are coordinated through the Social Services Specialist. They learn that there are others who care about them and want them to be successful. Depending on each student's level of need, some sponsors send a monthly allowance, while others send gifts on special occasions which might include clothing, toys, etc. Some families choose not to receive money or gifts, but may allow their children to enjoy receiving cards and letters.

JUNIOR HIGH STUDENT

- Student enrolled in the 7th-9th grades and passing all subjects.
- Write a 500-word essay without notes, in the presence of, and signed by, a teacher or school official, and the student, and then signed by an ESA member.
- Letters of recommendation from three (3) citizens of the community who are not related to the student (after local judging, the essay **may be** typewritten with necessary spelling and grammatical changes noted the **original** handwritten essay should be attached to the typewritten essay).

Judging is based on Quality of Essay, Leadership, Community Service, and Accomplishments which made the student outstanding.

The winner of the **Oklahoma Outstanding Junior High Youth Award** will be presented with a Certificate and a cashier's check to be presented at the State Convention held in the spring. Amount of cashier's check will be budgeted and announced the previous summer. The winner of the International Outstanding Jr. High Award will receive a plaque and a \$500 savings bond. The **deadline** for entry for the Oklahoma State Council and International Council Outstanding Youth Award is **March 1**. Since the deadline for both is the same day, you must duplicate your entry. - Provide a copy of the most recent and "certified" transcript to verify grades and/or test scores
- Letters of recommendation three (3) one being from a teacher or school official
- Personal essay on "What is the definition of an outstanding individual and how do I personally meet
 this definition." there is no specific length required typewritten essays are preferred and must be an
 original which is signed and dated by the contestant

Judging will be based upon the student's Character, Leadership and Skills and Scholastic Ability.
