

Music is Good for the Soul

Music Is Good for the Mind, Body, And Soul: Singing **Improves Memory, Mood in Dementia Patients**. In addition, the act of singing or listening to music was also found to alleviate depression in volunteers with mild Alzheimer's-type dementia. Music listening was also beneficial in supporting general cognition and working memory in volunteers with moderate dementia.



Why does music make us feel so good?

Music can also make us feel good by **amplifying our current mood** (think of the 'pleasure' of wallowing in a sad song when you're feeling down); it can also trigger fond or poignant memories. Then there's the social side: singing along with friends to a new tune from your favorite band fosters a powerful sense of belonging.



This is why music and music therapy can help counteract or prevent the damaging effects of chronic stress, greatly promoting not only relaxation but health. **State of Mind:** Music can also be used to bring a more positive state of mind, helping to keep depression and anxiety at bay.

The State Leadership meeting was held September 14, 2019, at the Goodrich United Methodist church, 200 West Hayes Street, Norman, Oklahoma.

President Linda Leveridge called the meeting to order at 10:00 a.m. The opening ritual and pledge of allegiance were recited.

State Chaplain Darla Barton gave the thought for the day.

Contest Chairs were introduced as follows:

Outstanding Youth-Janice Shockley. She has all the forms for requesting scholarships. If help is needed, please let her know.

Distinguished Achievement Award-Ramona Bench. She has forms and encouraged all to please recognize someone with great volunteerism.

Awards- Gloria Torres. She invited everyone to participate in the Essay and all other contests too. Please contact her for needed information.

Easter Seals-Linda Jones. She encouraged all to participate.

Circle of Life-Cheryl Young. She encouraged everyone to please participate.

Association of the Arts- Marilyn Fugate. Forms are available -Poetry, essays, other miscellaneous items. Marilyn encouraged all to check out the forms on our web site.

Care Connection- Marilyn Joplin. She encouraged participation in Hope for Heroes and has forms, also available on our website.

Contest Chair- Judy Cravens. She gave information regarding the judging forms. Margaret Kramer, Beta lota, McAlester made a motion regarding Judging Contests, in the STATE CONTESTS POLICIES AND PROCEDURES, SECTION 3c. read as follows, "The assigned District Coordinator AND/OR Sooner Seniorette must be in attendance during the contest judging, except for Distinguished Achievement Award and Outstanding Youth." Motion was seconded by Judi York, Beta Gamma, Tulsa. Motion carried.

Foundation Counselor- Vivian Gibson. She gave brief update.

Sharon Storms introduced speaker, Kyla McMoran. Kyla is with the Women's Resources Center in Norman. There are several shelters across the State. They help abused women train for the work force and give them security with a place to live. They handle all segments of crisis in people's lives. It was a very informative program.

The next speaker was Caitlin Potter with the Oklahoma School for the Deaf (OSD), one of our ESA State Projects. She gave a full report of school activities. They stay and attend classes Monday through Thursday and go home for the weekend. She also stated the little village was now complete on the campus. The school also has sports programs.

Lora Thompson gave a full report on Lola Jaegers. She and her husband were in an auto accident. He was killed. She will be in hospital in Indiana where her daughter can look after her.

Remarks: Linda announced the committee to read last June council minutes were Lola Jaegers (Chair), Libby Zaage, Maxine Whelan. They were approved by the committee then approved by the group. The committee assigned to read today's minutes are Judi York (Chair), Marilyn Hight, and Lora Thompson.

Linda asked all to review the packet she had brought to the meeting which included the State meeting dates, 2019 State council members, 2020 Executive Board, the General board and nomination officer forms.

Sharon Storms, Corresponding Secretary, announced Maxine Whelan had brought Laura Robinson's scrapbooks and commemorative pins for anyone who would like to take them.

Treasurer's report was given by Joyce Gibson. Balance as of June 30, 2019 was \$1479.79. Total income was 1203.59, Expenses were \$1322.86. Balance as of Sept. 14, 2019 is \$1360.52

First Vice President Mona Quaid Johnston announced her theme is "ESA Making Beautiful Music" and her convention theme for installation "ESA Music for The Soul." She is busy getting her officers in place.

Junior Past President Margaret Kramer, Disaster Fund Chair, announced we can begin sending in funds now. Margaret presented awards at IC Convention.

PJ Editor Gwynn Nell Swanson, announced PJ will be coming soon and it will be on the web site. She stated 1/2 page allowed for articles and 2 pictures.

ESA Foundation: International Vice Chairman, Judi York, said last year we implemented "Each One, Reach One" program for new Life Active ESAF members. *We* received 97 new active members. At this year's IC Convention there were 170 present at the Life Active Breakfast. *We* have *2* new members this year, Gina Wozencraft & Sigma Chi, Inola. Judi placed a card in each packet today about the Foundation Scholarship Program deadlines. Also, forms were placed on each table. From the Desk of Margaret Kramer, Disaster Fund Chair

Thank you to the chapters who have already given so generously to this years Disaster Fund. Last year in Oklahoma several of our Sisters who experienced a Catastrophic Events in their lives filed a claim and were awarded \$5000.00 in relief. Relief that they will never have to repay. This welcomed relief was possible by your individual and chapter contributions to this worthwhile cause.

If you are not a collector or are trying to downsize and don't know what to give to an ESA Sister, friend or family members as a gift, a contribution to the Disaster Fund would be a great idea. One size fits all, and as a bonus you will receive a raffle ticket for each \$5.00 donation. The winner of the raffle drawn at State Convention will receive a Carrot, Cheese and German Chocolate cake. All individual and chapter donors are eligible. Please be sure to include the Disaster Fund in you 2019-2020 Chapter budget.

Guidelines: INTERNATIONAL COUNCIL DISASTER FUND INFORMATION/GUIDELINES

PURPOSE The purpose of the ESA International Disaster Fund is to assist an ESA member whose home and/or personal belongings are destroyed or damaged extensively by one of nature's causes -fire, flood, etc. The need for assistance occurred in the current year from June 1 to May 31. Assistance may also be given when a member incurs heavy financial responsibility due to a debilitating illness or accident, which involves the member or their spouse or *immediate family who resides in the home due to physical or mental impairment whom they have legal guardianship over and are legally responsible.*

In the event a member's chapter requests additional help for them after one claim has been paid, the State Committee <u>MUST</u> investigate the application thoroughly. **The Disaster Fund is not an on-going source of assistance; a second claim will not be paid for the same illness or accident**.

If the State Committee establishes that the additional need is valid, the application must be submitted (along with the information regarding the reasons for recommending the additional claim) to the International Council Disaster Fund Committee Chairperson. Following receipt of such an application, the International Council Disaster Fund Chair will review with the committee, comprised of the IC Disaster Fund Chair, the IC President, and the IC First Vice President/President-Elect, and will make the final determination regarding the additional claim.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE TO APPLY: (1) Active Members of 90 days or more, (2) Members-at-Large who are in good standing with Headquarters, (3) Life Active Members will be determined by the IC Disaster Fund Chair in agreement with the IC President and First Vice-President/President Elect.

Thanks to all of our life active members. Oklahoma had 6 new Life Active Members. Over all there were 97 new Life Active Members between June 1, 2018 and May 31, 2019 which were recognized in Memphis at IC Convention.

The new Life Active Membership Drive for June 1, 2019 to May 31, 2020 will be recognized in Grapevine, TX at IC 2020. The Life Active Membership is \$500 and can still be paid in 2 payments of \$250 but it does have to be paid in full by May 31, 2020 in order to be recognized at IC in Texas. Remember, this doesn't have to just be for you, or even an ESA Member. it can be family members; it can be businesses and guess what.... it is a great birthday or holiday gift idea for that special person. Because of all of the support in the 2018-2019 campaign, the ESA Foundation was able to establish a St Jude Graduate School of Biomedical Sciences grant.

The mission of the St. Jude Graduate School of Biomedical Sciences is to educate and to train future generations of scientists seeking to understand the molecular basis of human disease and develop novel therapies based on that understanding.

The St. Jude Graduate School of Biomedical Sciences is designed to maximize student potential through self-directed learning, with guidance by world-renowned researchers and clinicians. Instruction is given in a dynamic environment that annually provides education and training to more than 200 affiliated undergraduate and graduate students, 300 postdoctoral fellows, 170 medical students, and 45 clinical fellows. Collaborative and translational research enables students to choose individualized paths to success and leadership in scientific discovery. These opportunities also raise awareness of the value and urgent need to develop young scientists who will discover cures and advance treatments for catastrophic childhood diseases.

JUNIOR HIGH STUDENT

- Student enrolled in the 7th-9th grades and passing all subjects.
- Write a 500-word essay without notes, in the presence of, and signed by, a teacher or school official, and the student, and then signed by an ESA member.
- Letters of recommendation from three (3) citizens of the community who are not related to the student (after local judging, the essay **may be** typewritten with necessary spelling and grammatical changes noted the **original** handwritten essay should be attached to the typewritten essay).

Judging is based on Quality of Essay, Leadership, Community Service, and Accomplishments which made the student outstanding.

The winner of the **Oklahoma Outstanding Junior High Youth Award** will be presented with a Certificate and a cashier's check to be presented at the State Convention held in the spring. Amount of cashier's check will be budgeted and announced the previous summer. The winner of the International Outstanding Jr. High Award will receive a plaque and a \$500 savings bond. The **deadline** for entry for the Oklahoma State Council and International Council Outstanding Youth Award is **March 1**. Since the deadline for both is the same day, you must duplicate your entry. Entry packets for the International Council contest are available through ESA Headquarters or at: <u>www.epsilonsigmaalpha.org</u>. Entry packets for the State contest are available at <u>www.oklaesa.org</u>, from the State Contest Chair <u>contest@oklaesa.org</u> or Outstanding Youth Chair <u>outstandingyouth@oklaesa.org</u>.

SENIOR HIGH STUDENT

- Be enrolled as a senior high student meeting one of three academic qualifications (ranked in the upper 25% of class; have a minimum 3.0 GPA, or have a minimum ACT score of 22 or SAT score of 1030)
- Provide a copy of the most recent and "certified" transcript to verify grades and/or test scores
- Letters of recommendation three (3) one being from a teacher or school official
- Personal essay on "What is the definition of an outstanding individual and how do I personally meet this definition." – there is no specific length required – typewritten essays are preferred and must be an original which is signed and dated by the contestant

Judging will be based upon the student's Character, Leadership and Skills and Scholastic Ability.

The winner of the **Oklahoma Outstanding Senior High Youth Award** will receive a cashier's check and a certificate from the Oklahoma State Council to be presented at the State Convention held in the spring. Amount of cashier's check will be budgeted and announced the previous summer. The winner of the IC Outstanding Senior High Youth Award will receive \$1,000 from the International Council. This may be applied towards tuition, registration, fees, books, supplies and equipment, or any other college fees or academic expenses. The **deadline** for entry for the Oklahoma State Council and International Council Outstanding Youth Award is **March 1**. Since the deadline for both is the same day, you must duplicate your entry.
