We have a new leader(s) who will try their best to return us to the safety and stability we have known as citizens of the United States and all the time knowing that the incident that has happened will forever be in our minds.

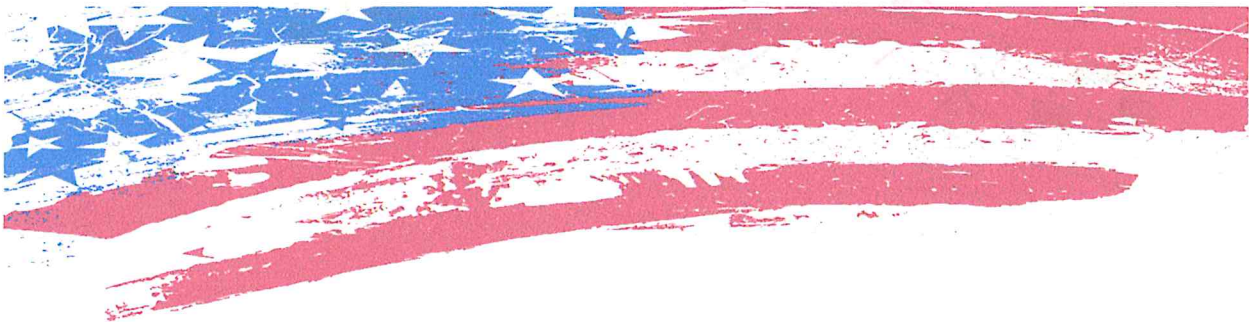
The last PJ article, I tried to not focus on anything political, but my ESA sisters, it is so comforting to know that through all of this, and no matter our opinion, we will be there for each other.

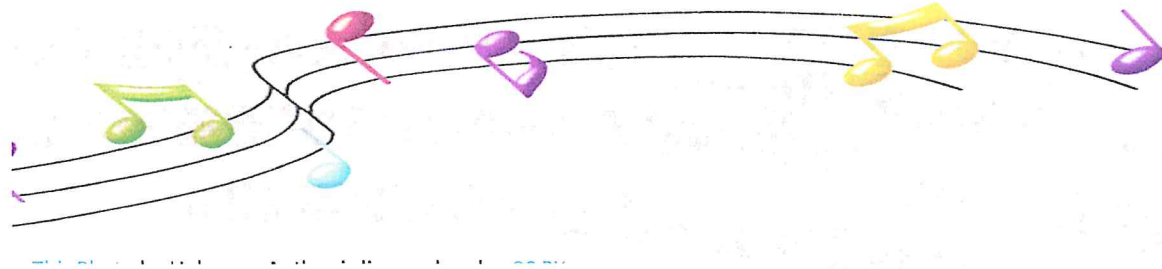

I am certain all of us were excited to see 2020 end as it was a year filled with many challenges and hardships. I am praying that 2021 will be a beacon of light for all of us, and that things can return to what we once considered “normal.”

I want to remind you that April 1 is the deadline for entry into the “What ESA Means to Me” contest. I know that we have all had more time than normal inside our homes, so, perhaps, we all have had time to think about the true meaning of ESA. ESA means different things to each of us. Why not put your thought on paper and write an essay to enter in the contest? The essay must be 300 words or less, and there are two categories: one for those with membership of one year or less and one for those with membership of more than one year. If 2020 did nothing else, it certainly caused each of us to appreciate what we had once considered normal—attending church, spending time with family, going to meetings, eating out with friends, and going shopping. We are all hoping that 2021 brings back our prior “normal.” I am certain you have missed seeing your Sisters in person, whether at a chapter meeting, a district meeting, or at the state meetings. Use these ideas as a springboard for your essays. Please check out the website to see the requirements for the entry and for the entry form. (Your essay must be in a folder with a cover page containing your name, your chapter name and number, your chapter city, and the category, i.e., less than one year or more than one year. You must type your essay using double spacing, and you must include 2 copies, one of which must be in a folder.) The entries must be mailed to me by April 1. The April 1 postmark will be the determining factor for the contest, but since the judging has to be completed prior to April 15, please allow ample mail time. It seems that the mail gets slower and slower each year. The results of the contest have to be sent to President Mona and Corresponding Secretary June Miller by April 15, so your early mailing of your entry would be appreciated. Use some of your “at home” time to create an essay. It will fill your heart with joy and bring back fond memories of your ESA experiences and your ESA Sisters! I hope to see your entry in my mailbox soon!

I, also, would like to remind you to send a list of your members who have achieved 5, 10, 15, 20, 25, 30, 35, 40, 45, or 50 years or more of service to ESA. These members will be recognized at State Convention.

Also, please send a list of those members who have received the First Pearl or Pallas Athene awards since the last State Convention. These members will, also, be recognized at the Awards Luncheon.

2021 is going to be a fantastic year! It will be so good to see each of you at State Convention on April 30 – May 1 at the Crowne Plaza Hotel in Tulsa. I am looking forward to receiving your entry into the “What ESA Means to Me” contest and to receiving information about your members’ service years and awards. Let’s make ESA music together by entering the contest!
