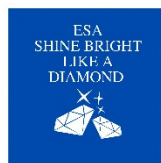
ESA for St. Jude Chair, Billye Putnam gave us some fun ideas on how to fundraise for the St. Jude's \$50 for 50 Challenge.

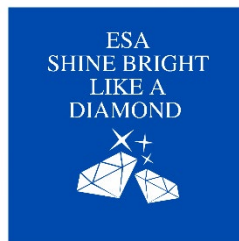

### **ROUTE 66 DINERS/DRIVE-IN'S, EAST TO WEST COAST**

#### **MISSOURI DINERS ROUTE 66 DINER, SAINT ROBERT, MO. –**

Saint Robert was originally a Dunkard Community. The Dunkards, or Dunkers were called so because they believed in baptism by dunking. They were Christians of the Church of the Brethren, formed in 1708 in Germany. This area became known as Gospel Ridge, and later, Eastside as it was east of Waynesville. The two alignments of Route 66 were the curved 1926-1977 roadbed and the straight addition built in 1942 that upgraded the road to a four-lane highway. The town was not platted and incorporated until 1951. The name comes from Father Robert Arnold, who established the Catholic parish for the staff at Fort Leonard Wood in the 1940's. So, the first church, dedicated in 1951 was obviously St. Robert Bellarmine a Jesuit Scholar (1542-1621).

The original Route 66 passed through town in 1926, aligned along old State Highway 14 east of Waynesville, the county seat. Just after World War II began and even though the U.S. was neutral, a large training camp was created just south of what would become St. Robert, Route 66 provided a good road access and a railroad spur carried even heavier loads. The heavy military traffic after 1940 led to Route 66's improvement from Doolittle to St. Robert: it was upgraded to a straighter four-lane divided highway.

St. Robert, known as Saint Robert, on Route 66 in Central Missouri's Ozarks has plenty of Route 66 attractions.

The Route 66 Diner, Saint Robert, Mo., opened in the 1950's featuring 1950's decor and an extensive menu of American dishes and desserts. It is noted for its pancakes, biscuits and gravy, hash browns, burger and fries, fried pickles, milk shakes and the old-fashioned root beer soda.

**ROUTE 66 HOTDOGS, SPRINGFIELD, Mo.** The building is an old grocery store built in the 1920's, located on old Route 66 itself. It serves 10 types of hotdogs that cost \$5.00 each. The service is personal and warm. They literally sell thousands and thousands of hot dogs annually to the locals and tourists that are traveling through Springfield.

**CASPER'S DINER, SPRINGFIELD, MO.** To say the atmosphere at Casper's is different is an understatement. They have a psychedelic décor that screams early 1970's. Quirky photos and rare collectibles, including a family of chalk dolls, give you plenty to take in as you wait for an over- filled cup of chili.

Casper's began serving chili in Springfield in 1909, eventually at two different locations before settling on Walnut Street over three decades ago.

Over that time, both locals and tourists have developed a nostalgia for the diner that is hard to match. It started as a Springfield staple and will continue a home-grown local family themed establishment. They are a very big family from many generations. Casper's has great food, excellent service, cute place, good prices, and limited diner menu. They serve "chili dogs, chicken sandwiches, cheese burgers, chili cheese burgers and fries". They also serve very good homemade ham and bean soup.

**IGGY'S DINER, CARTHAGE, MO** One of the cooks named Austin started as a youngster and could not pronounce his Uncle's name "Erick" so he just said Uncle "iggy". Thus, the name continued and the diner became known as "Iggy's Diner.

It is a Classic 1950's style nostalgic diner, friendly service, good food, and has a family atmosphere. People from all over the world travel Route 66 and come to Carthage, MO. and to Iggy's Diner. It has been rated as the "Best Diner" in Missouri.

It serves breakfast, lunch and dinner. Some of its specialties is the Farmer's Omelets, Iggy Burger and Fries, Reuben Sandwich, Chili Cheese Tots, and the Spaghetti Red.

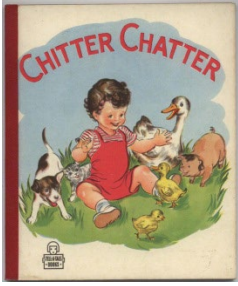

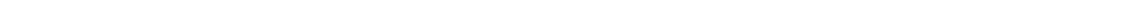
