A favorite newspaper columnist of mine is Harvey Mackay. While he writes a business column it is often easy to apply the same premise to our ESA organization. Smartly dressed in a white shirt, black tie, and freshly pressed black slacks, the cab driver jumped out and rounded the car to open the back passenger door for Harvey.

He handed my friend a laminated card and said, “I’m Wally, your driver. While I’m loading your bags in the trunk I’d like you to read my mission statement.”

Taken aback, Harvey read the card. It read, “Wally’s Mission Statement: To get my customers to their destination in the quickest, safest and cheapest way possible in a friendly environment.”

This blew Harvey away, especially when he noticed that the inside of the cab matched the outside. Spotlessly clean!

As he slid behind the wheel Wally said, “Would you like a cup of coffee? I have a thermos of regular and one of decaf.”

My friend said jokingly, “No, I’d prefer a soft drink.” Wally smiled and said, “No problem. I have a cooler up front with regular and Diet Coke, water and orange juice.”

Almost stuttering, Harvey said, “I’ll take a Diet Coke.” Handing him his drink, Wally said, “If you’d like something to read, I have *The Wall Street Journal*, *Time*, *Sports Illustrated* and *USA Today*.”

As they were pulling away, Wally handed my friend another laminated card. “These are the stations I get and the music they play, if you’d like to listen to the radio.” And as if that weren’t enough, Wally told Harvey that he had the air conditioning on and asked if the temperature was comfortable for him. Then he advised Harvey of the best route to his destination for that time of day. He also let him know that he’d be happy to chat and tell him about some of the sights or, if Harvey preferred, to leave him with his own thoughts.

“Tell me, Wally,” my amazed friend asked the driver, “have you always served customers like this?”

Wally smiled into the rear view mirror. "No not always. In fact, it's only been in the last two years. My first five years driving I spent most of my time complaining like all the rest of the cabbies do. Then I heard a motivational speaker on the radio one day. He said that if you get up in the morning expecting to have a bad day, you'll rarely disappoint yourself. He said, 'Stop complaining! Differentiate yourself from your competition. Don't be a duck. Be an eagle. Ducks quack and complain. Eagles soar above the crowd.'"

"That hit me right between the eyes," said Wally. "He was really talking about me. I was always quacking and complaining, so I decided to change my attitude and become an eagle. I looked around at the other cabs and their drivers. The cabs were dirty, the drivers were unfriendly, and the customers were unhappy. So I decided to make some changes. I put in a few at a time. When my customers responded well, I did more."

Mini-Educational

SNIDER PEANUT FARMS

The Snider family has been growing peanuts in Oklahoma for four generations. Their farms are located in Hollis, Oklahoma. Since the family knows all about growing peanuts, they decided they could cook and flavor them. In 2006, the Sniders opened the "Snider Farms Peanut Barn". It is family-owned and operated.

Their mission was to provide peanuts that taste fresh and have a great flavor. They even ground their own peanut butter. It is ground fresh, has a great peanutty taste, and contains no preservatives.

10 different flavors of peanuts is offered through the business and on their website at www.sniderfarmspeanutbarn.com

The flavors include Ranch, Sour Cream & Onion, BBQ, Cajun, Jalapeno, Nacho Cheese, Hot & Cheesy, and Honey Sweet. Of course there is the common plain ole roasted and salted peanuts.

VALLEY VIEW PECAN COMPANY

The Grundmann family grow pecan trees and process their pecans for sale to the public. They have been shelling pecans for more than 30 years and are located near Shawnee, Oklahoma. Ever wonder how pecans are cracked? Read about the process:

The process by which they remove the shell from the meat is quite amazing. First, they are brought into the plant in burlap sacks. Each sack will hold about 50-150 pounds of pecans. The sacks have a drawstring at the bottom, for easy release

of the pecans into the cracker machines. The old process took much longer. Their new cracker, called the Quantz Rotary Pecan Cracker will crack about 1000 nuts per minute, while the old ones cracked about 700. The Quantz uses a blast of air in a cylinder. As they are dropped onto the end of a table, the pecans are then shaken by a huge flywheel over holes in the table until they fall into their category. This separates the pecan halves and the pieces.

They are then shook out into an aspirator head. These pipes have a low pressure inside of them and this causes lighter particles (the shell and dust) to be pulled away and collected while the heavier particles (the pecan meats) fall out of the bottom and into a big 55 gallon bucket. The shells are augered into bins then into large sacks and sold to gardeners.

The pecans are sorted through channels and by an electric eye. Each piece is "read" from three dimensions and based on color, is either accepted and falls into the front barrel or rejected into the back barrel. The computer reading sends the bad meats with a blast of air into the bad bucket which is thrown away. The good pecans are cleaned thoroughly and once again sorted by the human eye. They are sold and shipped all over Oklahoma.
