Mini Educational by Gwynn Nell Swanson

Tucked away in the Northeast part of Oklahoma is the county of Ottawa. It is a small county in the extreme northeastern part of Oklahoma, bordering Kansas and Missouri. The county seat is Miami. It is the beginning of Route 66 in Oklahoma. Ottawa County was created in 1907 from the Cherokee Nation. The county was named for the Ottawa Indians, but the name comes from the Algonquian term "adawe", meaning to "buy and sell" or "trade and traffic". The county has been the home of members of a greater number of Indian tribes than any other county in the United States. The Court Clerks office maintains records of marriage, divorce, probate and civil court records. Land records dating back from 1890, are also kept by the County Clerk.

Ottawa County has quite a history of unusual town names. Names like Afton, Cardin (was Tar River), Commerce (was North Miami), Dawes 1901-1908 (named for Senator Henry L. Dawes of Connecticut, Chairman of the Dawes Commission), Douthat, Fairland, Fourmile 1882-1892 (named because it was four miles from the Kansas state line), Grand River (formerly Prairie City, present Wyandotte, 1976-1894), Halfway 1895-1896 (named because it was halfway between the Missouri state line and Vinita), Harland 1888-1893, Hockerville, Kema 1882-1884, Max 1891-1894, Miami, Narcissa, North Miami (present Commerce, 1913-1914), North Miami (another community named for the previous but in another location), Oseuma 1868-1909 (the name is from a Cherokee word for good water), Ottawa, Peoria, Picher, Pooler 1882-1892, Prairie City 1872-1876, Quapaw, Saint Louis 1917-1919 (later Zincville), Wyandotte and Zincville 1919-1954.

Ottawa County has 16 National Landmarks. They are; <u>Cities Service Station</u> and the Horse Creek Bridge are in Afton, the <u>Coleman Theater</u>, <u>Commerce Building/Hancock Building</u>, <u>Miami Downtown Historic District</u>, <u>Miami Marathon Oil Company Service Station</u>, <u>Miami Original Nine-Foot Section of Route 66 Roadbed</u>, <u>Modoc Mission Church & Cemetery</u>, <u>Narcissa D-X Gas Station</u>, <u>Ottawa County Courthouse</u>, <u>Peoria Indian School</u>, <u>Peoria Tribal Cemetery</u>, <u>Riviera Courts / Holiday Motel</u> are all in Miami. The <u>Tri-State Zinc and Lead Ore Producers Association Office is in Picher. The John Patrick McNaughton Barn is in Quapaw.</u>

The Modoc Mission church and cemetery is the last building left that was affiliated with the removal of the Modoc prisoners-of-war from Fort Klamath, Oregon to the Quapaw Indian agency in November 1873. They were Oklahoma's smallest American Indian tribe and were native to the Pacific coast. Following the Modoc War of 1872-73, 153 Modoc were removed to the Quapaw Agency in Indian Territory. The remainder of the tribe either eluded capture or did not participate in combat against the United States and were allowed to remain on Oregon's Klamath Reservation. In 1909 the Oklahoma Modoc were allowed to return to Oregon if they desired.

The Cities Service Station in Afton and the Miami Marathon Oil Company Service Station and Narcissa D-X gas station in Miami are good examples of early type of service stations on Route 66. Along with the service stations, there were many motels that were on Route 66 and the Riviera Courts/Holiday Motel was one of them located west of Miami. Speaking of Route 66, North of Miami is an original nine-foot section of Route 66 roadbed.

While in Miami, visit the Coleman Theater. Built in 1929 with a Mission/Spanish Colonial Revival look, the elegant Louis XV interior includes gold leaf trim, silk damask panels, stained glass panels, a carved mahogany staircase and decorative plaster moldings and railings. The original Wurlitzer pipe organ has been returned to the theater. The building is also used for other functions such as school plays, church meetings, etc.

The Peoria Indian School and tribal cemetery represent the only remaining resources of this tribe in the United States.

Get out and explore our beautiful state. Pick a county, print out a list of Historical landmarks in that county and visit them. There is so much history and beauty in our State.

As I contemplate what ESA means to me, my mind travels back fourteen years when I put my life on hold and set out on a journey with my teenage son in an attempt to make his world a better place. Our journey took us down avenues of frustration dealing with adolescent mental health professionals; the State Department of Education; legislators and insurance companies. I received training and became an advocate for children's rights. Unfortunately the journey for Daniel was brief and he died August 5, 1995. We donated his organs so that others might live.

I was consumed with grief, but instead of giving up, that grief drove me to make a commitment to tell Daniel's story and through sharing our experiences, positive changes would occur, laws would be changed, educators enlightened, parents encouraged and the world would be a better place.

How naive was that? There was no balance in my life. My family, career and health suffered. There was certainly no time for socialization. After all, I was a woman on a mission to make a positive difference in our world!

Eventually I resumed my career and refocused on my family's needs. I still share Daniel's story, but only when the occasion arises. Did my individual efforts improve others' lives? Perhaps. Was changing one life worth it? Absolutely! However, looking back, I liken my individual efforts to tiny pebbles randomly thrown into the ocean and the ripples their impact may have created were lost in the vastness of the sea.

ESA affords me the opportunity to unite my efforts with thousands of individuals possessing a common desire to make a positive difference in our world through service, education and fellowship. It is this opportunity I embrace as an ESA member.

What does ESA mean to me? FULFILLMENT!

Our prayers went out to Jacque over the holidays in the loss of her father-in-law (Joe Edwards).




