
March 1st is the deadline for Distinguished Achievement Award and for Outstanding Youth.

Albuquerque, New Mexico

Best burgers, best shakes, and amazingly great comfort food, in the 50's style.

People come from across town and from all over the world to experience the historic ambiance to enjoy the fabulous food and shakes. Not to mention touring the entire establishment. I have been there are several times, and it lives up to its advertisements. Very interesting place and a must see.

You will think you have stepped back into the 20's to the 60's with its electric ambiance?? Betty Boop, Elvis, Marilyn Monroe, vintage and neon signs, juke box, soda fountain and Pez collection are just some of what you will experience when you visit.

A portion of the dining room was once a mechanic bay, and there is a hydraulic lift still intact under the hopscotch court?? Back in the Route 66 heyday, the building was home to a Phillips gas station and service garage. In 1987, it was converted into a restaurant. The food, friendly service and nostalgic décor is all part of the homage to a vanishing part of America's history and the amazing legacy of Route 66.

KIX ON 66

Tucumcari, New Mexico

Kix on 66 is the best local breakfast place in Tucumcari. It serves Pankix, omelets, huevo Rancheros, house made sausage and much more. Kix offers up a full espresso bar. Breakfast is served all day and lunch offers sandwiches, salads, burgers and more. Kix on 66 has a great patio where your pets are welcome and there is even a **pet menu**.

It was established in 2004. Sisters Yvonne and Yvette built and opened Kix 66. It has grown to be a favorite landmark for Route 66 travelers in Tucumcari, New Mexico.

Some items on the menu include Huevos Ranchero, New Mexico Burrito, which is delicious, Runnin Burritos, Corn Beef Hash, House Baked Cinnamon Rolls, Grilled Cheese Paninis, very large Sandwiches, Tucumcari Club, Tijeras Quesadilla, Santa Fe, and Quay County.

I have also eaten at this establishment, and it is very, very, good.

DEL's RESTAURANT

Tucumcari, New Mexico

Look for the large cow/neon sign of the restaurant!!!!!!

In 1956, Del Akin started, then owned and operated Del Restaurant until 1978, when he Sold it to his secretary, Jessica Braziel. At the time Del was skeptical "a woman could run a Restaurant" but the rest, as they say is history.

Since 1956, Del's Restaurant has been a destination break on Historic Route 66. Stop in and meet the friendly staff and enjoy delicious food, an attractive setting and over the top service. Whether your hunger is more on the light side, or one would have worked up a vigorous appetite.

Chase Waters returned home to Tucumcari in the late 90's to purchase Del's where he worked as a 16-year-old high school student. He still owns and operates Del's today.

It serves some interesting items such as Breaded Olives, Calamari Fritto, Mediterranean Mussels Tuscan Harvest Bowl, Boar Gnocchi, Arri-Burrata, Butternut Ravioli, Umbrian Boar, Pera Bianca, and Plant based items such as, Trio Fromaggi, Vento, Gluten Free Potato Crust, Funghi Crostini, plus Pompell Bowl, and for dessert, Coconut Crème, Tiramisu, and Crème Brulee.

I have driven by this establishment but never stopped. I want to stop by the next time we go that way which will be later in 2023.




