Donations to the foundation can also be counted. Your philanthropic year is from April 1 st to March 31 of the following year. Their chapter created a Google drive for each member to use with many ESA and chapter folders. It contains pictures, minutes, philanthropic forms, dates of events and chapter directory. Patty presented certificates to Melissa and Lori for their informatory workshop.

Convention Chairman Cathy Holsted invited everyone to the 2024 Convention April 26, 27, 28, 2024 at the Delta Hotels by Marriott and Reed Conference Center in Midwest City. Linda also announced all the IC convention winners. 27 Oklahoma members attended the IC Convention. Won Honor Award for most new members, Gold Seal Awards for Beta Gamma and Gamma Zeta, Jacque Cantrel one 1 st place for the Maie Wells educational notebook, Linda Leveridge won 1 st in Visual Arts, 1 st place in philanthropic monies, award for 20+ new community members, St. Jude Pinnacle Award (over a million dollars raise in a single campaig Danny Dream Award, foundation won most monies donated to the endowments, 3 rd place for Fun Fest and 2 nd in the Fantasy Event. Linda Jones was also nominated and won the BJ Clark Award for the most Outstanding State President.

Linda Jones gave Vivian Gibson's report on the foundation. Scholarship season is now open as of September 1 st . Please contact everyone you know who has a high school student, any college student or someone going back to college is eligible to apply. Also, don't forget to donate to the Grants and remember your dues are due by December 31, 2023. There is a new program for the Foundation called Pathway. Jennifer Sparkman explained about the Pathway program. This is to celebrate ESA members, community volunteers, or other special people with your gift to the Pathway Program. There are many different levels of donations from \$25 to \$1000. She also announced MARC convention is in October in East Peoria, Illinois and he Western District meeting is October 21 at the American Legion building in Guthrie.

PJ Editor GwynnNell Swanson announced that the October/November issue is due the 15 th but she will accept your articles no later that October 1 st. If you send in a picture, please send it in jpg. She's having a hard time converting from Iphones and with articles and reports.

Holiday Greeting from Beta Iota, McAlester


Since the last PJ publication our group has been keeping busy, doing fun activities, fundraising, selecting Outstanding Youth both Junior and Senior, and DAA.
